"For some years Sir Oliver Mowat has been hobnobbing with the temperance people of this province. By direct pledges and indirect assurances that he would do all in his power to curtail the liquor traffic, he has drawn to his side the bulk of the prohibitionists.

"If he was honest in the course he followed in the past he now has a chance to show it. He should at once dismiss the license commissioners of the city of London. They have over-riden the will of the people as expressed at the polls, and have acted in a manner which shows them to be utterly unworthy of office in a democratic country.

"The people of the forest city voted some years ago that the bars of that city should close at ten o'clock. The city council passed the bill and the license commissioners of that period carried it out.
