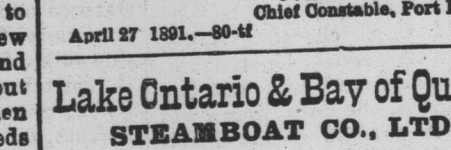

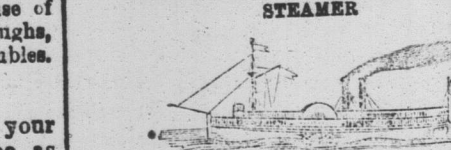
STR. NORTH KING LIGHTED BY ELECTRICITY. HEATED BY STEAM.

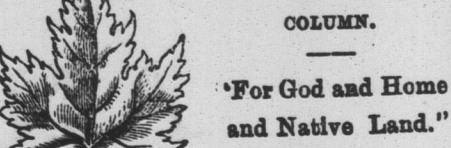

from prevailing methods of shipping out carcases of grain asked for by the boards of trade should apply only to Fort William and Port Arthur. The autumn contained in this provision is the key to the whole agitation raised by the few eastern dealers from whom, by force of natural circumstances, an extensive trade has passed into other hands.

Charles H. Oramp has represented to the navy department at Washington, that there is no adequate dock in the north harbor for vessels of the size of the new battleship, Indiana, and recommends that she be taken to Halifax, and it is possible that she will be taken there.

With regard to the question, however, of mixing of wheat, it will be remembered that representations on this subject were made to the controller of inland revenue last year. Thereupon Mr. Wood instructed assistant commissioner of inland revenue, Mr. Gerald, to proceed to Port Arthur, Duluth and other western ports, to examine into and report upon the method of grain inspection.

THE REAL QUESTION. The question at issue really resolves itself into this, are the Toronto and Montreal boards to decide how the Manitoba crop shall be handled or the standards fixed, or is the Winnipeg board to have the principal say in the matter?

With the exception in Montreal of Ogilvie and Lake of the Woods milling companies, as noted elsewhere, who have no vested interests in Manitoba, or right or title to interfere in the conduct of the grain business in Manitoba.

This year smutted wheat in Manitoba (which by the return of the grain less than 13 per cent of the total crop), can, with the extensive and improved appliances provided, be cleaned up to a good sample, and under prevailing regulations and methods dealers have been enabled to so handle this class of grain as to give the producer practically a one or two hard prices less the actual cost of thrashing and cleaning.
