**Widow of Sir Geo. Cartier Dead**  
Montreal, Feb. 28. — Lady Horatia Cartier, nee Fabre, widow of the famous French Canadian statesman, Sir George Cartier, died yesterday at Quebec, France. The same was conveyed by cable to Archbishop Brodeur, and his Grace, after having quietly passed the way through friends and relatives, himself paid a visit to the deceased lady's aged mother, Mrs. Fabre, to formally announce the event. The effect upon the venerable lady, who is now 86 years old, may easily be imagined, especially in view of the fact that she has even now hardly recovered from the grief caused by the death of her eldest son, the late Archbishop Fabre, who died at the end of December, 1895. Lady Cartier had resided in the south of France ever since the death of her husband, and she had made a host of friends in the famous winter resort of Cannes, where her name was associated with many works of charity. All prominent Canadians visiting France always made it a point to pay a visit to the widow of the Canadian statesman.
