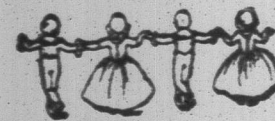

FREEMASONRY IN THE PHILIPPINES

One of the principal causes of the outbreak of the rebellion that has been raging in the Philippine Islands for the past two years, and the one which excited so much bitterness against the priests, was the determined efforts of the Spanish authorities, inspired by the Church of Rome, to suppress the Masonic Order which had obtained a foothold in the islands.

When a few years ago the secret Order was introduced into the archipelago the notoriously corrupt and despotic clergy, who had grown enormously wealthy through the favor of the authorities, saw that it would only be a matter of time before their power would be crushed by the Masonic body. The loges gave the natives opportunities for airing their grievances without fear of betrayal, and they grew rapidly in numbers, spreading from Cavite (where they originated), to the most distant islands.

Now that Admiral Dewey is practically in charge and an American army on the way to occupy the islands there will be among them thousands of Freemasons who will not forget that the origin of the recent troubles was the desire of an effete and decaying Church to suppress the Christian Order of Freemasonry.—Orange Sentinel.
