

The maritime provinces, true to their old principles, wave a large majority for prohibition. Territories were tavorable by small maorities. The greatest surprise was in Oxbow 166 Ontario. Gibraltar Tunnel Project

The French engineer, Berlier, whose scheme for tunneling the Stratts of Gibraltar has just been approved by the Spanish Government, gives as an estimate of the length of the projected work 28 kilometers, and says the greater part will have to be cut in solid rock. Although the present design is to connect a point of the Spanish territory with Ceuta, it is desmed necessary to have the cooperation of the British Government, and M.
