Do You Own a Watch?

Have you ever stopped to consider what a watch does?

It is depended on for nearly every action of our lives. It is expected to be perfectly regular in its habits, no matter how irregular we may be in ours. It must indicate, almost to the very second, the time for our most important engagements, and must keep this up, summer and winter, for years.

The steam engine is cleaned and oiled at least once in ten hours, and it seldom runs more than ten consecutive hours without rest.

The watch is in constant motion for years, and sometimes the thoughtless owner allows it to run for several years without cleaning or oiling.

What would you think of an engineer who cleaned and oiled his engine but once in three years? What would you give for his engine after a few such years?

The Life of a Watch.

The life of a watch depends greatly on the care which the owner bestows upon it. It should be cleaned and oiled once a year. Many good watches are allowed to go without cleaning and oiling, and the result is the oil is entirely dried up, the pivots are cut and rusted out, and it will cost nearly as much as a new movement to put it in proper condition again.

Does Your Watch Need Cleaning? Most Likely.

A good watch is the cheapest in the long run, and if it is carefully cleaned and oiled once a year, or even two years, it will probably last a lifetime; yes, a hundred years. Such a watch is a source of satisfaction to its owner. He can meet an engagement or catch a train and never has to excuse himself with "my watch must be slow."

Hints.

Keep your watch pocket free from dust; don't carry matches and tobacco in it.

Don't open your watch oftener than necessary.

Wind your watch but once a day, and as nearly as possible at the same hour.

Do not keep moving the regulator back and forth. If your watch runs fast or slow, bring it in and we will alter the regulator without charge.

Don't turn your watch back and forth to agree with every clock you see. You will often find your watch is right and the clock wrong.

Be careful to whom you trust your watch for repairs or cleaning. The watchmaker may be honest, but ignorant. His ignorance may cost you the price of a new watch. An unskillful workman will do a watch more harm than years of wear.

Never allow a traveling tinker to repair or clean your watch, if you value it. If a man is a capable workman, he can afford to rent a store, and can make a living in any town.
