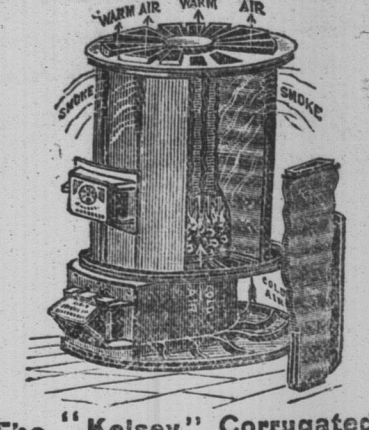

The Wool Question.

The recent heavy importations of Canadian delaine fleece wool, or rather combining Lincoln, Leicester and Cotswold long wools, to Great Britain is an indication to our farmers what class of sheep to breed.

In the reports of the leading wool centres of the United States, it appears to be strange that Canada choice, unwashed wool is quoted higher by 2 to 3 cents per pound than the same class of wool in any state of the American continent.

Choice, selected Canadian wool in Philadelphia is quoted at 22 cents a pound, while in New York, Michigan and Wisconsin are only quoted at 14 and 15 cents a pound, and in the washed wools of the several south and west-western states are only quoted at 7 to 8 cents a pound.

With the present fashions in woollen goods, and the demand for early lambs in our local and foreign markets, farmers should thrive by keeping a good class of long-wool sheep of the breeds mentioned.
