

Soak an ounce of refined gelatine sold water for an hour, then drain off and squeeze out the water as much as possible. Put the gelatine in a jelly-pot, and place the pot in a pan of hot water over the When the gelatine has melted, stir in slowly 22 ounces of pure alcohol. Put in a wide-mouthed bottle and cork tightly. This glue or paste will keep indefinitely, and can be melted for use in a few minutes by setting the bottle in a basin of hot water. As it contains a very small percentage of water, it affects the gloss of the prints but little, and dries almost immediately. - Harper's Round Table.
