

German-Chinese Wrangle.

London, Nov. 19 - According to a special despatch from Shanghai, Admiral Von Diedrich, commander of the German cruiser Division, before landing marines at Kiao. Chau on Monday morning, notified the British, French and Russian admirals of his intention, and it is said that the Bussian admiral expressed approval. The Chinese do not appear to be much

distressed over the matter, declaring that Russia, Germany and France are preparing to attack Japan, and will use Kiao Chau Bay as a naval base.




