Chris. Cornell Tells of His Trip to Klondike

Mr. Peter McGraw, who arrived in Winnipeg on Friday direct from Dawson City, Yukon, carried with him two lengthy personal letters from Mr. Chris. Cornell, formerly of Lindsay, to a member of the Winnipeg Free Press staff. Chris. has many interesting tales to tell of life in the far north and in his letter of September 18th expresses fears of famine unless additional supplies arrived before the Yukon closed for navigation.

Mr. Cornell writes that people make a mistake in going to the Klondike with the idea that gold strikes have been made on all the streams. The big finds have occurred on two streams only. He says: "I am afraid they will be a lot of disappointed people; of course there will be more creeks discovered, but nothing like Bonanza and Eldorado creeks."

Every creek within one hundred miles around here, where there is supposed to be a little gold, is all staked off. Hunter Young of West Selkirk, and Cameron of Oak Lake, and myself, went up the Klondike for about twelve miles for saw logs. We were gone three days the first time and made \$85 each; the next time we brought a raft of fifteen logs each down and made \$48 each; we were away four days. Great fun riding a raft down. The river is very swift in places and sends you against the bank with great force.

We left our tent with blankets and grub enough for four days, to look at Meadow Creek, some forty miles away over a range of hills. We got to Bannerman's cabin—brother of Archie—by noon, some eighteen miles up Bonanza river, stopped all night, and Archie Bannerman and A. McCraig came along with us next morning. We started at six o'clock for a twenty mile tramp; made the creek at four o'clock; put down our stakes and made camp for the night; got started next morning at seven a.m. for Bannerman's; had dinner on the top of the hills in a snow drift; used up all our grub, as we expected to get back for supper.

The creek that we had started for was named Eureka, on the Indian river, some sixty miles from Dawson City or two days' tramp from Bannerman's cabin. We had a rough sketch of the country. None of us had been over the ground before, and it is easy getting lost among the different ranges of hills, but we thought we could make it with the direction had. We were somewhat tangled up the first day, and received two additions to our party. We got a good start next morning and made Indian river by noon after some little difficulty. We had to climb trees to find the direction, as it was so heavily timbered we could not see. One big hill we had to climb when all players went out; it was very steep and we would sink up to our knees in moss, making it hard walking. We shot a chicken and had it for dinner.

Now the question was: Was Eureka up stream or down. Mae wanted to go up stream a way, but the others thought we had struck the river far enough up, and it was seen all around we would find it. We traveled all afternoon, following a very crooked river; but no Eureka. We shot a goose and a duck; cooked our goose house to sleep in and started out again next morning and got to Quartz creek. There we knew we were some 60 miles too far down stream. Examined our grub and found we had just enough to carry to home. So we started back home. Slept

the hills that night, which was a little bit cold; got to Bannerman's next day. All waited for him before going to town. We made Indian river that night. Started up river next morning, and made Eureka river at noon. We staked that evening and had supper, which was "slap-jack" and bacon; in fact, "slap-jack" were our principal standby all through our trip. We had two pans going, and did not make them last evening. We had next day, and pulled out next morning. We met some fifteen others just getting in. They said everybody was talking about the new find and that there was a big stamped area. We met some 20 more among the hills, who were trying to find it, but half of them will never get there.
