GAS.

Mr. McEwan, late assistant-master of Oakwood high school, now of Meaford and Toronto, last year took out a patent for making illuminating gas in small and cheap quantities.

He has finally completed the fixtures in The Warder office with some improvements, and now at any time one office can be lighted with a gas costing from 20c. to 50c. per thousand feet, as compared with the \$3.00 per thousand of the town.
