The condition of the Supreme Treasury requires that Assessment No. 38 shall be called to the Supreme Secretary, and that individual members shall pay Assessment No. 39 on death No. 89.

Your Treasurer will immediately forward to Supreme Secretary, Toronto, Assessment No. 38, that is, the amount of one Assessment for Beneficiary Fund, on all members of your Circle who were initiated on or before March 26th, including the assessments paid by those who have withdrawn, died or been suspended since the date of the death on which the last assessment was called.

Your Financial Secretary will proceed to collect another Advance Assessment from all members in good standing on March 26th, which amount, together with the advance assessments paid by those initiated between March 26th, and the close of the date of the death on which the next assessment is called, will be Assessment No. 39.

Subordinate Circles must have Assessment No. 38 in the hands of the Supreme Secretary on or before April 21st, 1890, or they will be recorded as suspended. Individual members must pay Assessment No. 39 to the Financial Secretary on or before May 1st, 1890, or they will stand suspended by law from all benefits. All suspensions must be announced at next meeting of the Circle. The Supreme Secretary should be notified **within five days** of all suspensions and reinstatements. See Law 6, page 57, sub-section 6.

Each Circle suspended on this Assessment must pay a fine equal to Ten Cents for each member before it can be reinstated.

Blanks for the use of subordinate officers accompany this notice. The Financial Secretaries must forward to the Supreme Secretary the notice of the receipt of the Assessments. [See law 1, Section 6, 7, 8.]

Remit only by draft on Toronto Post Office Money Order, or Express, and prepay all expenses of remittance.

This will be the first assessment notice received by some of the Circles, and the Financial Secretaries should number the first column on their Beneficiary Assessment Book No. 38, credit all included in this call with having paid Assessment No. 38, post these payments to the Beneficiary Assessment Book, issue notice for them to pay No. 39, and continue subsequent entries in numerical order.

NOTICE PROVISION IN REGARD TO SUSPENSION AND FINE OF DELINQUENT CIRCLES.
