This road would possibly be a few miles longer than via flarrie and Waubaushene, but the time that could be made over it would be much better than over one west of Lake Simeos and along Osorgian Bay shores. The distance via Lindsay would not be more than twenty miles greater, the road would be almost a perfect level, devoid of bridges, except a few small ones; and would in every respect be a race and casthy kept road. Via Barrie, the road would pass over the high ridges between Kleinbury and Bond Head, and through the hilly country in the townships of Vespra, Oro, and Medonte. Thence to Sudbury it would cross the inlets, guiches, rivers, ravines, and rocky ridges found in enclose number and variety near the Georgian

Looked at from a view-point of (1) speed, (2) rich country, (3) level bed, (4) ease of construction, (b) cheapness of maintenance, (0) absence of bridges, and (7) control and volume of local traffic, the route via Lindsay offers superior advantages over any other, for, here, the whole Trent Valley system of waterways would be bapped. The only advantage via Barrie is a saving of less than twenty miles in mileage, which adding the windings over the Oak Ridges, through Medonte hills, and among the rocks along Georgian Bay shores, would be reduced one-half.
