LONDON, Ont., Dec. 16. - Mr. W. R. Meredith met fully 1800 of his constituents of the Forest City to-night. The gathering was in the Grand Opera House, the capacity of which is about the same as that of its namesake in Toronto. A London political audience is proverbially punctual and well behaved. Both of these traits they exhibited to a degree this evening. No political man was ever given a more orderly hearing.

Mr. Meredith next put himself on record as the opponent of exemptions from taxation generally, save in respect of the slight exemptions that working men now enjoy on their incomes. There is no doubt, he said, that the Government could do in enquiring into the industrial and social problems instead of its everlasting contests with the central Government on provincial rights' issues.

Turning around to Mr. Ingram, Mr. Meredith made reference to his position in the Legislature on behalf of the workmen, and the audience gave him a big cheer.

Then Mr. Meredith branched off into what he described as the vexed questions of the day and he did not let go these subjects until he wound up at 10.30. It was not until the last hour that he got thoroughly warmed up. With some contempt he repudiated the everlasting "No Popery" cry that was raised against him whenever he discussed questions of the day in which his fellow catholic citizens were interested. He proposed to speak with emphasis on the subject.

What country in the world, he asked, gives any greater privileges to its roman catholic citizens than this great province of Ontario? There was no office in it that was not open to a roman catholic, in theory at least, and still when he attempted to discuss questions which concerned roman catholics, he was met with the everlasting, down with the no popery cry and the thunderbolt of a powerful church was turned against him. This was done in the last general election. [Applause.]

Across the border, in the great land of freedom there was not a single separate school from one end of it to the other. The members of the United States had thought it right to deny their fellow catholic citizens the use of separate schools. But in Ontario they were guaranteed under the great charter by which we were governed. He considered it was a great mistake when separate schools were established and he would not go a jot further in opening the door for their further extension. [Applause.]
