REFORM MEETING.
We are pleased to learn that, in view of the approaching election for the House of Commons, a meeting of the Reformers of North Victoria will be held at Kirkfield at an early date, and that circulars to that effect will be issued in a very few days. The meeting would have taken place before this had not circumstances prevented; but there is still time for thorough organization and preparation for the coming struggle, which is likely to be one of almost unprecedented obstinacy, and it is to be hoped that when the representative men of the party come together they will engage in the work before them with the zeal and energy that invariably characterize the movements of their opponents.

The Trial of Guiteau.
The trial of Charles J. Guiteau for the murder of President Garfield commenced over two months ago and is still in progress, but the probabilities are that it will not last many days longer. It has been one of the most extraordinary affairs of the kind on record, and in the opinion of the civilized world is a disgrace to the nation. A prominent English lawyer some weeks ago expressed his astonishment at the farcical nature of the trial, and said that in Britain it would have been begun and ended in a day, as the assassin was taken red handed and the plea of insanity would not have been listened to for a moment; but they treat murderers differently in America, where so many of them escape on one pretext or another that it would be better to abolish capital punishment at once and substitute therefor a penalty that could be discontinued the moment it was believed to be wrongly inflicted. Guiteau himself wisely denies that he is or has been insane, and boldly affirms that he was inspired by "the Deity," who compelled him to "remove the President," in order to "save the country from civil war; while the counsel for the defence assert that the prisoner's belief that he was inspired is a direct proof that he is insane, and on this ground they claim a verdict of not guilty. According to last accounts, an impression prevails in the States that Judge Cox thinks that Guiteau is insane, and that the jury are likely to disagree, especially as one of them is said to belong to a family in which there is insanity, and will, therefore, probably sympathize with the criminal. Whatever opinion those extraordinary people in the States may entertain with reference to Guiteau's mental condition when he shot the President, the belief elsewhere will be that he was fully sane as the average American; that he knew full well the criminality and illegality of the act that he was committing, and that nothing short of the direct interposition of "the Deity" should be allowed to save him from the gallows. It is often urged that "it is better that a dozen murderers should escape than that one innocent man should be hanged; and whether this be true or not, it is undeniably true that it is better to hang an innocent man than that a dozen innocent ones be shot, and there will be no end of shootings and assassinations by other means if Guiteau be acquitted because he asserts, but cannot prove, that he was inspired.
