A CASTAWAY CREW.

Eighteen Months Spent by the Crew Upon
One of the Most Barren Islands
in the Universe.

The wrecking of the American bark Trinity,
near Heard Island, in October, 1880, and
the hardships of its crew, for fifteen months
confined on a desolate and almost barren
island before they were rescued, afford a most
interesting and thrilling story. The following
official report of the commander of the
United States steamship Marion, which was
sent out in search of the shipwrecked crew,
and found them at an almost starving
condition, furnishes the details of the
search, the shipwreck, and the suffering
of the crew, which will be read with
interest.

USFV'S STEAMSHIP MARION (Third Rate)
CAPT. TOWN, South Africa, Feb. 20, 1882.
SIR: I have the honor to report the arrival
here of the Marion, under my command,
after a cruise of fifty-eight days to Heard's
Island in the South Indian Ocean, in search
of the crew of the American bark Trinity.

WRECKED ON HEARD'S ISLAND
In October, 1880, as I telegraphed the depart-
ment this morning, I rescued thirty-three
men, being the entire crew of the
Trinity, with the exception of the
cook, carpenter and Bernard Kelly, seaman,
who died Jan. 30, 1881, from exposure,
while hunting on the island for food. Three
bodies were found two days afterward and
buried by their shipmates. I have given
the men in charge of the Marion the best
disposal of in accordance with consular
regulations.

A SMALL BARREN ISLAND,
twenty-five miles west of Heard's island. At
10 o'clock a. m. the fires were lighted, and
at 1 o'clock, Heard Island being in sight, we
stood along the south side of it, going as
near as I dared, hoping to discover the
Trinity's crew if they should be there. The
Trinity's island was very incomplete, and I
therefore approached the land very cautiously.
I found soundings of nineteen fathoms
along the south side of the island, where
none were given on the chart. I was also
greatly confused by the appearance of the
land, not being able to plot positions by
bearings. This I found afterward, was due
to an increase of variation of the compass
of 11 degrees by the volcanic character of
the island. The island was enveloped in heavy
clouds, and below the clouds there was a
covering of snow and ice, the glaciers extending
to the water. Occasionally the clouds lifted,
and the sun shone brightly, affording a
fine view of the snow clad mountains, and
thousand feet high. At five o'clock in the
afternoon, as we were nearing the eastern
end of the island,

MEN WERE DISCOVERED
at the foot of the mountain, where there was
little or no snow, and we soon received an-
swers to our signals. Continuing on beyond
the line of heavy breakers we sounded the
long split that extends out to the northeast
in the shape of a "S" on the back of the
island, and then stood in the Spit Bay, where
we anchored in twelve fathoms of water, at
9.30 p. m. As the surf was running high on
the beach, I waited for daylight to send
boats ashore, the men on the island keeping
up a bright bonfire during the night, making
it easy for me to see the men. I found that
we had been there for three days, and that
we should know they were there. Early on
the following morning boats were sent in,
and thirty of the Trinity's crew were brought
on board, the others having been left on the
west end of the island. In the afternoon I
got under way for Corinthian Bay, twenty
miles off, where we arrived at dark. The
remaining three men were brought on
board early the following morning, and
in the midst of a driving northwest snow-
storm.

SAILLED FOR CAPE TOWN.
I intended to stop at Kerguelen for a few
days, to exercise the crew on shore and for
target practice, and on the evening of the
10th of January, being off Greenland Harbor,
I went in the night to the island of Crozier,
and during the day the crew succeeded in
getting a harbor, but soon after getting outside
it came on thick, with a strong head wind,
which we could not steam against, and as
the supply of coal was low, and the boilers
were leaking, the crew had to be hauled
out, and I was compelled to abandon all idea
of stopping at Kerguelen.

before our arrival, and they were greatly re-
duced for the want of strengthening food
we found them. The clothing they
had worn so long was in a wretched con-
dition, and I thereupon, upon the recom-
mendation of the surgeon, threw aboard such
as he considered unfit to allow on board, and
issued to each of the men a suit from the
store. There are only two known anchorages
in the department.

It is difficult to imagine a worse climate
or more desolate place than
HEARD'S ISLAND.
Although we were there in the summer the
weather was very cold, and it blew a gale
of wind every day while we were in the
vicinity. There are only two known anchorages,
and these, besides being exposed to the
north and east winds, have no holding ground.
The sending of a vessel like the Trinity,
poorly equipped, to lead three men on such
a voyage, is in my opinion reckless in the
extreme, or else shows indifference to her
fate.

On Jan. 8, latitude 51 degrees south
and longitude 60 degrees east, we passed
a large iceberg, while others were seen
from aloft.

I am glad to report officers and crew in
excellent health.

The Elephant in the Middle Ages.

Matthew Paris mentions that the Sultan
of Babylon, Mark of Kamel, sent an elephant
as a rare present to the Emperor Freder-
ick II., in the year A. D. 1229 (Sir Freder-
ick Madden's edition of the "Historical
Minor," vol. II., p. 31). But it was not
until the year 1255 that the first elephant
was seen in England. This was presented
by the king of France to our King Henry
III. The chronicler, John of Oxenides,
chronicles the arrival of this animal at Lon-
don, and declares that he never before
brought to England before. Of the elephant,
Matthew Paris made a very good draw-
ing, the manuscripts in the British Mus-
eum, (Nero, D. I.), and an equally good
one in the Bodleian, (Nero, D. I.), and an

12 years, the charge amounted to £106
13. 1d. The name of the keeper is recorded
to have been John Goch. Many chroniclers
mention this elephant—(s. g., Matthew Paris,
iii., 334; annals of Bur-
ton, 1257; the "Majors" of Matthew
Paris states vol. v., p. 489) that no elephant
has ever before been seen on this side of the
Alps, but that statement will hardly agree
with the record of the elephant presented to
the German Emperor in A. D. 1229, as al-
ready mentioned. Goch was ordered to
see the king's elephant, according to this
author, and we may well believe. The
drawings seem to indicate an Indian rather
than an African elephant, but it is difficult
to determine the question.—London Times.

A Big Job.
The Government of Holland had definitely
determined to reclaim the Zuider Zee,
which has an area of 20,000 hectares. The
engineers in charge of this work have been
engaged for ten years past in preparing the
plans, and the total cost is estimated at
not less than \$46,000,000. The dyke will
be forty-one kilometers in length, and will
extend from the city of Enkhuizen to the
coast of the province of Overijssel. The top
of the dyke will be built to the height of
five meters above the level of the sea, which
will bring it 2.05 metres above the highest
tide. The dyke will be formed from sand
and faced with clay, and will be built of
sufficient dimensions to resist the heaviest seas.
It is intended to commence operations on
the work at four different points, and the
calculation is to have it completed in from
seven to ten years.

Prosperity in Ireland.
A return which has just been made in re-
gard to the condition of the joint stock banks
in Ireland, at the close of the year, shows
that the deposits in the banks and cash
balances have increased from one hundred
and fifty million dollars in 1880 to one
hundred and fifty million dollars in 1881.
This is a gain of five million dollars, or 1.81
per cent. The circulation, it is stated, has in-
creased by two and a one-half million dollars,
and an additional evidence of prosperity is found
in the fact that the deposits in the postoffice
savings banks were larger than in any year
since 1862, when they were tabulated.
