What a Three-Cent Stamp Will Do. ately over each window attach a rope or cord, say three-eighths of an inch in size and long enough to reach nearly or quite to the ground. This cord should be well made and pliable and be knotted at intervals of about fifteen inches. The cord should be rolled into a coil or ball and tied in place by a small cord or strap, ready at a moment's notice to be united and the end thrown out of the window. 


