In London we are accustomed to furious driving of all sorts. Cabs, light carts, railway vans, and other vehicles are driven through the streets daily with frightful velocity, regardless of consequences, and, as we know by sad experience, often with lamentable results. have, however, hitherto been fortunately spared such a spectacle as that witnessed at Canterbury a few days ago, when a huge steam roller was seen tearing along the main street at the rate of ten miles an hour in charge of a man almost helplessly drunk. 
