Great Auk, and the Dodo. About 100 years ago the voyagers to the Arctic seas were familiar with a large and powerful animal resembling our manatee; in fact, it was a northern representative of this animal, called the Rhytina. It was extremely common, seemingly taking the place of the clovenfooted creatures among the milk-givers of the sea. In general appearance the Arctic sea cow was a stupendous spectacle, attaining when full grown a length of 35 feet and a weight of several tons. The general color was a dark brown; the skin thick and leathery, covered with a thick, bristling hair that matted together, forming a protection from the ice and cold, and was compared in appearance to the bark of a tree. The head of the sea cow was small in proportion to the animal's size, and, instead of possessing teeth, was provided with two curious masticating plates-one in the gum, and the other in the under iaw. The tail somewhat resembled that of a whale, having two flukes. . The fore fins or paddles were blunt and without nails, having instead a thick growth of bristling hairs.
