The colonies mention that a happy pair entered the queen's town house, the bride wearing a \$3 note, signed a document, took possession by the arm and walked her out of the building, saying: "How do you do, Mrs. —" The ceremony lasted just two minutes.

An unpublished letter from Blucher, written immediately after Waterloo, comes to light in Berlin. The marshal writes: "My child, the finest battle has been fought, the most glorious victory gained. Details will follow. I think the Bonaparte affair is now again settled."

A Burgess Hill (Sussex, England) letter to the London Daily News says: There is at present in this parish an old Waterloo veteran between 80 and 90 years of age. He was not only present at the great battle, but lost a father and two brothers on the same day.

Advices from Madagascar state that Lieut. Col. Willoughby, an English officer, who distinguished himself in the Zulu war, had arrived there, and was in consultation with the prime minister, with a view of improving the organization of the Hova army.

The third richest man in the union, according to the New York Morning Journal, is John Jacob Astor, the chief owner and heir of the Astor estate.

Among the valuable buildings principally owned by Mr. Astor's chief heir to the estate is the old landmark, the Astor house, which was sold to his father by his grandfather, the founder of the immense estate, for \$1.
