The Government of London.

We are apt to think of London as single, vast city, covering a wide area and teeming with a population of four millions of souls. What we do not fully realize is, that London, while geographically a great and compact mass, is, politically speaking, simply a combination of a large number of separate towns, each partially independent, in government, of the others.

What is called "the city of London" is but a very small part of the metropolis. Otherwise London is divided up into a large number of parishes, which are governed by "vestries," and into boroughs, like Westminster and Southwark, which have still another kind of government.

There are one or two "Boards" indeed, which exercise their functions throughout the whole area of the metropolis. These are the Board of Works, which establish the roads, make regulations for health, and look after the sewerage, water, and so on; Commissioners, who manage the police force of the entire city.
