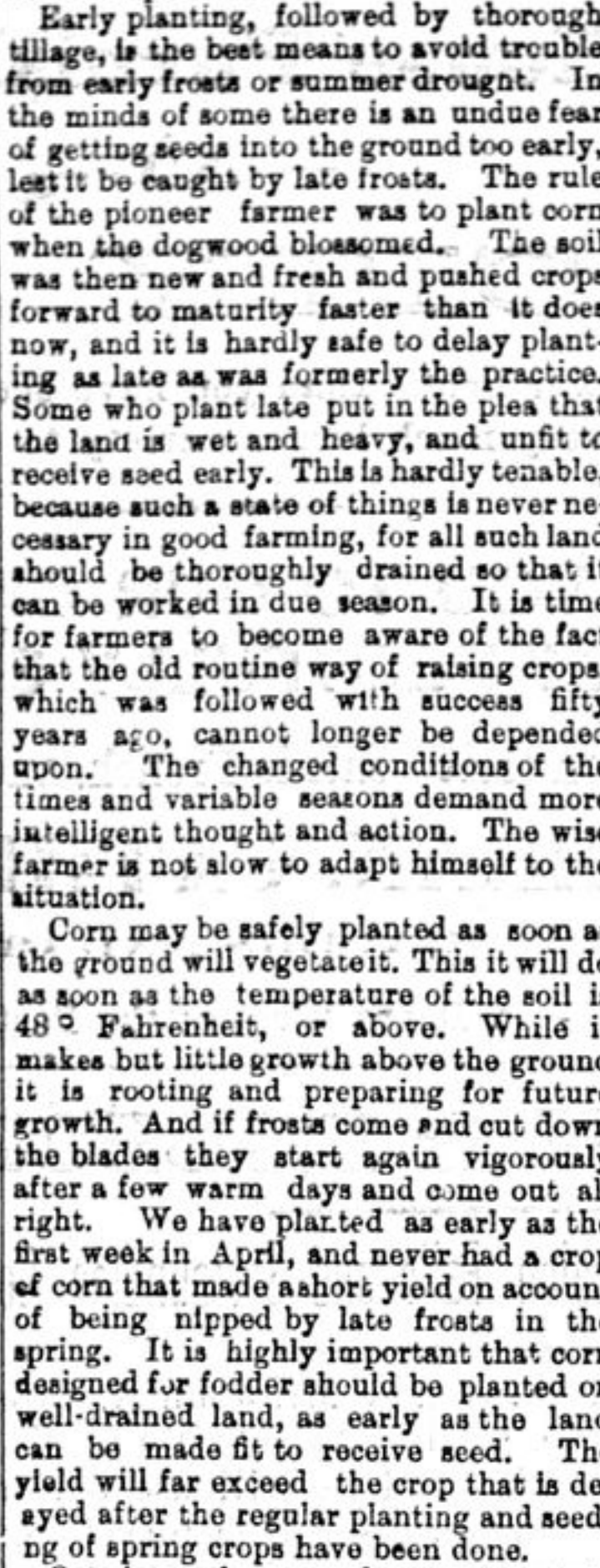
The best information in regard to a farm can be gotten from the neighbors. It is the season when few are buying farms. Generally if a man is possessed with the idea he wants to buy a farm...
