Defeat of the British Government.

Lord Salisbury's Government, the existence of which may be reckoned by days, is already a thing of the past, having been defeated last Tuesday by a vote of 329 to 250, the adverse majority, 79, being about equal to the number of Home Rulers in the House.

Nothing is more certain than that the Irish will obtain a certain measure of home rule sooner or later, and it is almost equally certain that it will be a Liberal and not a Tory government that will grant it.

The Queen's Speech (as it is called) at the late opening of Parliament, foreshadowed repression and coercion, and more crimes and outrages would have been committed, and more obstacles thereby thrown in the way of an amicable settlement of the vexed question; but Lord Salisbury has been deprived of the power of carrying out his threats, and Mr. Gladstone will have an opportunity of grappling with the difficulty, which he will solve if any man can, and which would only be aggravated and magnified by the line of action favoured by his opponents.

The vote last Tuesday was on Mr. Jesse Collins' amendment to the Address, regretting that "no measures are announced in the Queen's Speech for the relief of the sufferers by the depression in trade and agriculture, particularly in regard to affording facilities to farm labourers, etc., for obtaining allotments of small holdings on equitable terms as to rent and security of tenure;" and the result is declared by the English papers to be a victory for Parnell, who, the *Poll Moll Gazette* says, "confronts the country as a modern Warwick, being a king maker in reality." The *Irish Times* says that the Parcellites rely for help on Gladstone alone, believing he will make them an offer looking to the settlement of the Irish question; and as it is almost impossible for any Government to exist—or, at any rate, to carry on the business of the country—if opposed by all who follow Parnell, and as Mr. Gladstone is as free from prejudice and passion as any statesman in the world, the *Irish Times* is probably right. Affairs are, however, in such a state that nothing is certain, and, as some of the leading Liberals are opposed to any concession to the Irish demands, it is quite possible that Parliament may be dissolved and the country be put to the turmoil and expense of another election.

If the voters of Great Britain only knew enough to give Mr. Gladstone such a majority that he could do as he pleased, there would soon be peace, for he would voluntarily grant all that could reasonably be asked, and the Parcellites, feeling their inability to compel him to give more, would take what they could get, on the principle that "half a loaf is better than no bread." But if the Tories had a thumping majority they would go in for coercion, the coerced would go in for revenge, and there would be a pretty kettle of fish in no time.
