

Barges For Our Canal.

During the sittings of the Trent Valley canal commission in Peterboro', the question of barges suitable for the lockage capacity of the canal, being able to stand a lake voyage, say from Trenton to Toronto or Kingston, turned largely upon the build or barge known as the turtle back or whale back boat. In these vessels the upper works are dispensed with altogether, and an air chamber about high water mark extends the whole length of the ship. The hatches are fitted into rubber grooves. The hull differs little from the ordinary vessel, and the weight of the cargo prevents rolling. Only a couple of feet of the whale back appears above water, and consequently winds and waves pass over it harmlessly, for there is practically nothing to resist their passage. Such a vessel costs only about half an ordinary one, and the running expenses are light. A Canadian named McDougall, living at Duluth, is the inventor of the idea, and the principal owner of the seven or eight ships to which it has been applied. They are now plying regularly from the upper lakes to Buffalo. The whale backs are said to be an entire success, and it is believed they will drive all other styles of crafts from the lakes. If the brilliant idea of the Duluth Canuck is not completely worked out, it is probable that there will be plenty of time to bring it to perfection before the canal is finished.—*Peterboro' Examiner.*

A Freak of Nature.

A curious feature of agriculture happened this season on lot 15, concession 3, Sullivan Township, about five miles west of this place, which completely eclipses anything we have ever seen during our agricultural experience. A year ago last spring Mr. Wm. Cram sowed a field with bald wheat, and seeded it down, from which he reaped an excellent crop of fine grain last summer. The grass seed made a good catch and the grass looked well last spring, but what surprised him was the manner in which it appeared to sprout from the roots of last year's wheat stocks. While the blade did not look like timothy, that was accounted for by the supposition that the grass seed had not been pure timothy, and it was not until it began to shoot out with heads that it was seen the crop was fall wheat grown from the roots of last year's spring wheat crop. It turned out a splendid crop of fall wheat of the bearded variety—although the crop that grew from the same roots the summer before was of the bald variety. The hay was also good, and the combined crops were so heavy that they had to be cut with a mower, and are now safely housed.—*Chatsworth News.*

Sable Island.

A new chart of known wrecks on Sable Island, compiled to date from official reports, has been issued. The last wreck occurred on July 27, 1890, to the Norwegian barque Guda. Over 150 steamers and vessels have gone to pieces on the fatal shores of this bleak island; in fact the triangular area formed by Cape Sable, Cape Breton and Sable Island is the charnel house of the North Atlantic. Within this area occurred the greatest loss of life recorded in Canadian history, when in 1873 there were 545 persons lost off the steamer Atlantic in Tenace Bay. It is some satisfaction to know that Sable Island, once 40 miles by two and a half, is now only 22 miles by one. There is now at Halifax, in charge of one of the officials of the Marine Department, a loft of recently imported carrier pigeons, intended to be placed on Sable Island, to be used in conveying intelligence of wrecks, so that succor can be sent in a few hours after the despatch of the winged messengers.
