God forbid that I should glory save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ .- Gal. VI. 14. This is the vigorous and courageous language of a man who was too logical for credulity, too rational for fanaticism, too learned for deception, and too conscientious for hypocrisy. It is not an empty boast. There was not in his day a man of greater intellectuality than St. Paul. There was not in the schools of Greece a philosopher living who was capable of writing the fifteenth chapter of First Corinthians, that sublime treatise on the future state of the dead, a production in the presence of whose splendor pale the brightest thoughts of Plato. We may safely challenge any historian to name the rhetorician then living capable of writing the sixth chapter of Ephesians, a description of the Christian soldier and his armor. The orator can not be mentioned who could have delivered, at that time, the extempore address which Paul made to the Athenians on Mars' Hill, or the ingenuous defense which he made before king Agrippa.

The ethical writer did not exist, in that day, who could have produced the thirteenth chapter of First Corinthians, that incomparable, almost angelic strain on Charity. Nay, there was not another son of the Hebrew race living at the time, with learning, logic, scriptural knowledge and spiritual-mindedness to write Paul's letter to the Hebrews, that clear, yet profound commentary on the exposition of the Levitical ceremonialism.

No other Christianity but that of the cross has ever saved a soul or converted a nation. A Christianity without a cross, without an atonement, without the cleansing blood, is a sham and a fraud. To preach it is an im-

position. And the cross of Christ is more than the cross of martyrdom or it is infinitely less. The anost illogical doctrine ever taught is that which holds Jesus up simply as a martyr to truth. He was a martyr to His divinity and Messiahship. If He was not divine, if He was not the Son of God, if He was not Messiah and Savior, then He was simply a martyr to a lie, and a Christianity which robs the crucifixion of its atoning power and Jesus Christ of His divinity and Saviorhood invites the world not to admire a martyr to truth, but a martyr to error. What the cross represented on Calvary, that it represents to us, that it has represented to all peoples, the vicarious death of the Son of God, the power of God unto salvation, the wisdom of God unto all spiritual enlightenment, the love of God unto all grace and comfort and hope. Therein is its power. The cross makes living beautiful, the cross makes dying sublime.

As the cross is this to mankind and makes no false claims, men and nations have not trusted it in vain. It has sustained, strengthened and exalted them. Nearly every ruin of man or nation has been but the logical outcome, the inevitable consequenc of building on false hopes and wrong principles. How sad and frightful to see a man sink into the darkness while despairingly clutching an error which he has mistaken for truth !'




