Russian advices report the discovery of great coal oil fields in the region of the Caspian sea. The production of these fields is said to be more than ten-fold greater than that of any other existing oil territory.

The latest novelty in sport in Texas was a goat race, on which hundreds of dollars changed hands. The race took place at Houston in the presence of 5,000 people, and the mayor and other officials took a prominent part in the fun.

One thousand dollars more than the price paid for the land is Henry Mitchell's reward for planting eight acres of sweet potatoes. His farm is at Swedesboro, N. J., and good seed with good tilling brought him \$250 an acre for the sweet.

Notice is hereby given that the above petitioner has on the eighth day of September, 1891, lodged at the office of the Registrar of the Queen's Bench Division of the High Court of Justice for Ontario notice of an application to withdraw the petition, of which notice the following is a copy:—

"The Petitioner proposes to apply to withdraw his petition upon the following grounds:—

"He was induced to become the petitioner herein by corrupt promises having been made to him by one Samuel Hughes and one Hugh McDougall.

"He had no knowledge at the time he signed said petition, nor has he any knowledge now, nor has he ever had any knowledge of any corrupt practices of the said John Augustus Barron, either by himself or by his agents, or by other persons on his behalf, before, during, or after said election.

"He knows of no reason why the said John Augustus Barron should not be a member of the House of Commons for the said Electoral District of North Victoria.

"And prays that a day may be appointed for hearing his application."

And also notice that, by the rule made by the Judge, any person who might have been a petitioner in respect of the said election may, within five days after publication by the Returning Officer of this notice, give notice in writing of his intention to the said Judge, or to apply for leave to be substituted as a petitioner.
