Ontario's Standing.

The Montreal Star (Conservative) points out the splendid position which the provincial affairs of Ontario have attained under the Administration of Hon. Oliver Mowat. It gives the debts of the other provinces as follows: Quebec, \$34,000,000; Nova Scotia, \$1,552,500; New Brunswick, \$2,159,749; Manitoba, \$3,442,196 and British Columbia, \$1,772,871. Alongside with these debts our contemporary places Ontario, with not only no debt, but a substantial surplus of \$5,285,000, through the interest on which the Province is enabled to give liberal aid to the schools, charitable institutions, agricultural societies and other strictly Provincial institutions. Indeed it is a splendid showing.

The Grand Duke Ludwig IV. of Hesse-Darmstadt, husband of the late Princess Alice of England, died on Sunday.

A colored man ran amuck in the streets of Toronto on Sunday and fired at every one he met, but fortunately without hitting anybody. He was finally arrested.
