Vernlam Council.

Bobeaygeon, Monday, June 27th, 1892.
Council met as Court of Revision;
all the members present, the reeve, Jas.
Lithgow, in the chair.
As there were no further alterations
to be made in the assessment roll it was
duly confirmed, and the clerk authorised
to sign and certify the same.
The court was then closed.

The council now proceeded to regular
business.

A communication was read from the
clerk of Fenelon, notifying the council
that Fenelon had granted certain sums
on the boundary between Fenelon and
Vernlam, and asking Vernlam to meet
them with an equivalent amount.

Moved by D. Robinson, seconded by
John Lewis, That this council confirm
the action of the reeve in engaging R.
J. McLaughlin to defend the suit of F.
D. Moore vs. the municipality, and that
such further steps in the defence be
taken as the solicitor directs.—Carried.

Moved by J. Kelly, seconded by J.
Lewis, That \$25 be granted to road
opposite lot 22, 8th and 9th con. line.—
Carried.

Moved by J. Lewis, seconded by J.
Kelly, That Wm. Davidson, pathmaster,
be instructed to at once proceed to have
the statute labor performed in his divi-
sion, and to have all fences and other
obstructions to progress of the work
removed; and in the event of his neglect
or refusal to do so that steps be taken
to have the provisions of the road by-law
enforced against said pathmaster.—C'd.

A petition was presented from James
Robertson and thirteen others, praying
for a grant of \$125 on the quarter line
between lots 10 and 11, across the 6th
concession.

Moved by D. Robinson, seconded by
John Kelly, That \$90 be granted on
the quarter line between lots 10 and 11,
across the 6th con., and that John Lewis
be the commissioner.—Carried.

Moved by W. Mann, seconded by J.
Kelly, That the clerk advertise and
give notice of the following by-laws: A
by-law widening the road along the south
side of the east half of lot 5 in the 1st
con.; also a by-law widening the road
along the south side of the west half of
lot 26 in the 6th and conveying the same
to Samuel Newman; also a by-law clos-
ing a part of the present travelled road
through the east half of lot 18 in the 3rd
concession and opening a new road in
lieu of the portion so closed.—Carried.

Moved by W. Mann seconded by J.
Kelly, That the Clerk have all Road
by-laws registered which have not al-
ready been done, at his earliest con-
venience.—Carried.
