A Panie in Hamburg and an Exedus of Well-to-do People.

Over 800 New Cases fu Hamburg in One Day.

A Hamburg despatch says :- The sultriness of the atmosphere since early last evening has caused the cholera to spread with increased rapidity and hopes of the near abatement of the disease have received a shock. To-night 810 new cases and 319 deaths are reported for the day. The number of interments yesterday was 290, almost three times the average in healthful times. Many of the burials now take place at night, as then there is not only less danger of infection, but also fewer persons abroad to be panic stricken by the appalling frequency of the funerals. Most bodies are unaccompanied by friends or relatives. Persons of the poorer classes dying in hospitals are buried without any attempt at ceremony and without having been even seen by their friends or family.

The long-expected panic seems to have come. The exodus of families of property is continuous and increasing. The railway stations are full night and day, and there is difficulty in finding porters enough to trans-port the baggage. Business is dead. Most of the shops not dealing in daily necessities are closed. Those that remain open do hardly a tenth of their usual trade. The cafes are deserted. The hotels to-day received but twenty-nine persons, and most of them are virtually empty. The loss of trade in the last three days is estimated to be in the millions. All persons arriving from cities suspected of infection are carefully, examined and their baggage is fumigated. So far the progress of the plague has been too small to affect very noticeably the city's daily life. Only before the bill boards, where the official reports are posted, and on the street corners, where sanitary instructions have been placarded, is any variation of the regular routine to be observed. At these places small groups have gathered all day. A laborer in a group near a bill board near the foot of the Friedrich strasse this morning was taken suddenly ill and fell groaning with pain to the ground. At the police station, three blocks off, the physicians pronounced the laborer's case to be of the genuine Asiatic cholera, and the man was removed to the Moabit hospital.

They made frantic resistance, and the other show people hurried to help them. A riotous scene ensued, and the police had much difficulty in quelling the disturbance.

Reports from forty towns in North Germany, exclusive of Hamburg and Altona, show that in each cases of cholera have been discovered. In none of them, however, has it become epidemic, and in all the cases the victims have been isolated. The Berlin health officials profess confidence that the country has seen the worst of the plague.

The North German Lloyd Steamship Company has announced that each of the steamers of that line will carry two doctors during the prevalence of the cholera epidemic. All their vessels will be disinfected twice daily, and all baggage will be disinfected in a special shed before it is allowed to be put aboard the steamers. During the voyage only water that has been boiled or mixed with muriatic acid will be supplied to crews and passengers.

London telegrams say: -Ida Samyan, the four-year-old child of Russian immigrants who was taken to the London Hospital on Sunday, suspected of having cholera, is dead. The post-mortem examination revealed acute inflammation of the bowels, but not cholera.

Two passengers from Hamburg, who had passed the doctors' examination as being well, were seized with symptoms of cholera at their homes in Islington to-day.

The bark Helene, which left Hamburg on Aug. 20 for America CARFIELD TEA cures Constipation, Sick Get Free Sample at GARFIELD TEA AGENCY, 317 Church St., Toronto. has been detained at Dover, on account of sickness on board. Last evening the Helene was towed to Gravesend, and two of the crew, afflicted with Asiatic cholera, were taken to land, and put in the hospital.

KILLED WHILE AT PRAYER.


Struck by Lightning.
