The Macdonald Bust in St. Paul's Cellar.

Mr. J. Castell Hopkins has transmitted to the Spectator a letter from "a friend in England," contradicting what he calls "the absurdly ignorant article of the Hmilton Times," with regard to the location of the bust of Sir John Macdonald in the cellar of St. Paul's Cathedral, next to the monument of a London stationer, whose only title to fame was that he married somebody's daughter. Mr. Hopkins's correspondent says "the crypt of St. Paul's is the Metropolitan Valhada, as is the floor of Westminster Abbey," and he adds that

TORONTO, Feb. 7 .- Yesterday at Osgoode Hall, judgment was given in the trouble between the College of Physicians and Surgeons and Dr. Nelson Washington, of this city. The college authorities last summer struck the doctor's name off the college register, claiming that he had improperly advertised himself in Ottawa, Kingston and other cities, and for publishing in the papers certificates of those he had cured. They also charged him with having led ignorant people to believe they had catarrh by publishing symptoms of the disease. The judgment as delivered yesterday sustains the action of the college authorities, and Dr. Washington's name is therefore struck off the list as a practising physician of Ontario.

Canadian Order of Foresters.

The Canadian Order of Foresters is a fraternal benevolent society, incorporated in 1879, and registered under the insurance corporation act, 1892, of Ontario. The objects of the society are to furnish its members with sick and funeral benefits and an insurance of one or two thousand dollars. The payment of these benefits range from about one dollar to one dollar and fifty cents per mouth, according to the age of the member, and the amount of insurance carried. The membership is composed of men only, and when admitted they must be between the ages of eighteen and forty-five. The present number of members is over 16,000, and the society has a cash surplus on hand for the payment of the insurance of over \$215,-000, \$50,000 of which is in Dominion of Canada bonds, and the balance is invested in the best monetary institutions of the Province. In addition to this, courts have about half a million of dollars in their treasuries for the payment of the sick and funeral benefits. The high secretary of the Order is Mr. Thomas White of Brantford, and it is expected that a court of this popular and purely Canadian society will shortly be organized here.-49-3m.
