

**The High Priest of the Sun.**

The "High Priest of the Sun" is dead. This was Dr. Wm. Price, of Llantrissant, Glamorganshire, who has enjoyed a most varied career, and who has just died at the age of 92. The great aim of the deceased was to dress in the style affected by the Druids, which, if Dr. Price succeeded in getting anything near the truth, must have been singularly picturesque. The main features were a whole foxskin on the head, light green trousers scalloped at the ends, and a cloak almost as liberally scalloped and of the same pale verdant tint. The Druid seems to have dressed fairly well, if this is any criterion. The light green unmentionables, however, did not end the eccentricities of the deceased high priest, who achieved further fame by his marriage 10 years ago, when he was 81, to a girl of 19, and also by his well-meant endeavor to cremate his child on a funeral pyre in the fields. But that was before the question of this form of disposal came to be favorably considered, and the police intervened. Dr. Price also found time to be a Chartist, and in the time of the riots of Monmouthshire, £100 was offered for his body dead or alive. He escaped to France, however, and there was received by Louis Phillippe.

**Lost Everything.**

Rev. Samuel Chadwich, of Leeds Central Wesleyan mission, told the following story in an address in the United Presbyterian Synod hall, Edinburgh. He had in his mission one of the saddest and most tragic cases he had ever experienced. A family that 25 years ago used to drive to chapel in a carriage and pair were now living in a dirty hovel. The woman on the morning of the marriage received as a wedding present from her father £50,000. Mr. Chadwich found some time ago that her husband had just died in a common lodging house without a shirt on his back, and there was the widow in that little hovel without furniture--the only remnant of the old days being a carriage lamp that had once lit the way for their carriage. In one corner of the place lay a daughter dying of consumption. In the other corner was a second daughter ill with typhoid fever. They had not a bit of bread or a copper at their command. The home had been wrecked through drink--stripped, the minister said, by the devil, and the family cast out by society. That was the sort of work the devil did.

**The English as Medicine Takers.**

Statisticians have proved beyond dispute that the average of human life in this country at the present time is longer than it has ever been. Whether this be due to the quality of patent medicines which the inhabitants of Great Britain now swallow, as compared with their ancestors, is a question to which qualified medical practitioners would have no hesitation in giving a decided answer; but the fact remains that at this moment Englishmen are taking these Government-stamped nostrums in a manner to make the rest of the world wonder. During the rest of the year the revenue derived from the three half-penny stamp placed upon the patent medicines amounted to £240,062, an increase of £14,361 over the sum paid in the previous twelve months. The quantity of pills, lotions, powders and ointments represented by the figures must be something enormous. Licenses for the sale of these compounds have also increased by 1,340 in England and 111 in Scotland, from which the revenue benefits to the extent of £7,186. The total income derived by the State from the patent medicines is thus £247,250 London Telegraph.

A male gorilla (gorilla gina) has lately been adopted by the Berlin aquarium. He is supposed to be eight or nine years old, and was for six years in the possession of a chieftain on the Gabon. He has not yet shown any friendly feeling for man.

The island of Heligoland, in the North Sea, which was ceded to Germany by Great Britain two years ago, has just had its first case of leprosy. The victim, an old woman, spoke disrespectfully of the emperor, for which terrible crime she was arrested and taken to Altona, where she was convicted and sentenced to three months' imprisonment.

Police magistrates and police officials will do well to learn a lesson from the verdict given recently in the York Assizes. A respectable citizen was wantonly arrested for failing to attend the Toronto Police Court as a witness when not properly subpoenaed. The jury find that the magistrate who ordered the arrest acted hastily, and that the police inspector who effected it was prompted by improper motives. The one is ordered to pay \$1,500 damages and the other \$500. The verdict is an important one, and calls for the fullest assurance that the public will not be subjected to such annoyances in future.
