"The British Ministry has intimated privately that while they feel sympathy in the movement for the Pacific cable, they prefer to delay in taking action in the matter until after the Australian-Canadian conference to be held at Ottawa in June, so that they may see what the colonies themselves are prepared to do. The advent of the Earl of Rosebery to the Premiership increases the prospects of the success of the project greatly."

### The Russo-German Treaty.

Some of the most important provisions of the Russo-German commercial treaty are contained in the concluding protocol. At the present time the Russian duties on certain articles when imported into the country through the Baltic ports are lower than those levied on the same goods when imported overland. Russia now binds herself to reduce the latter to the level of the former when the treaty comes into force, and not to impose any new differential tariff for the import trade of the Baltic, the Sea of Azof, with the exception of the Caucasian coast, and the Black Sea. In return for this the German Government agrees not to introduce more favorable duties on any of the frontiers of the empire than those on the boundary between it and Russia. Further, the two powers consent to support each other to the best of their ability in the regulation of the railway dues, and to co-operate in the introduction of direct freight tariff, especially on the lines leading to the German ports of Dantsic, Konigsberg, and Memel. This agreement applies only to the state railways, but the two Governments pledge themselves to do all they can to induce the private lines to adopt the same tariff. Russia agrees to accept the German gold currency in payment of Customs dues at the rate of 1,000 marks to 308 gold rubles, and to offer no opposition to the return of Jewish emigrants of Russian origin provided with a Russian passport if they have not sojourned more than one month in Germany. This last stipulation is especially interesting.
