## Railroad Development.

Relatively to its area, Europe is much better furnished with railway facilities than any other of the world's continents, and even in Europe, where the railway system had its origin, and where it attained to its vigorous adolescenceat a much earlier period than elsewhere, unless weexcept the United States, the rate of growth during the last decade has been considerable. It the whole of Europe were to be supplied with railways to the same extent, relatively to area and population, as the United Kingdom, the railway system of this old Continent would still appear to be only in its infancy. The British Isles have an area of 121,115 square miles, and as the mileage of railways opened is now close on 20,000 miles, there is, roughly, one mile of railway to six miles of

If the same relationship of railway mileage to area were to be established in Europe generally, the total railway mileage, instead of being only 136,562 miles, would be raised to about 630,000 miles, or nearly five times as much as it is at the present teenth of the world's known land surface, so that if the density of railway mileage were as great throughout the land surface, of the globe as in the British Isles, the ultimate railway mileage, instead of being only about 370,000 miles, as in 1890, would rise to 8,866,000 miles or nearly thirty times as much. This, of course, is an impossible figure, and is only interesting as showing what still remains to be done in the way of extending the existing network of the arteries of commerce and travel.

A large part of the land surface of the globe is uninhabited, owing to its aridity or to the rigors of the climate. No one would dream of constructing railways in "Greenland's icy mountains," although a good deal has already been done, and much more remains to be achieved in "India's coral strand."-[The Fortnightly Review.
