Fenelon Court of Revision.

Glenora, June 5th, 1894.

The council met as a court of revision, all the members present.

Moved by Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Currie, that Mr. Chambers be chairman of this court.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Graham, That Wm. Jeffrey be assessed as tenant of broken lot 25 concession 10 instead of George Jeffrey; that J. W. Wallace be assessed as tenant of lot 21 west of Lindsay street, Cambray, that S. Armour be assessed for Sturgeon Point lots now entered to J. Anderson; that George Rutherford be assessed for lands now entered to the Hilliard estate; that the assessment of part of lot 11, concession 10, assessed to J. Wethrup, be struck off, and that his assessment be reduced \$100; that Mr. Wilkinson's assessment be reduced \$200, that J. A. Ellis's assessment be reduced \$200, and that the appeals of T. Thompson, N. Day and J. Powles be not entertained, and that the roll as now amended be finally passed and signed by the reeve and clerk.—Carried.

The council then took up general business. Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

A petition from Donald Tolmie and others asking the council to grant assistance to Sarah McFayden was read.

Moved by Mr. Graham, seconded by Mr. Currie, That the clerk is hereby instructed to enter the roadwork due on the west half of lot 23 con. 4 on the beat where the land is situate and to advise Mr. Smitheram to that effect.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Graham, seconded by Mr. Hall, That the following accounts be paid: E. D. Hand, advertising court of revision, \$1.50; G. Lytle, printing, \$9; Township of Mariposa, Goose Lake drain, \$5.37; J. Campbell, use of hall for council, \$1.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Palmer, seconded by Mr. Currie, That the following grants be made out of the poor rate; W. Hutchison and wife, \$13; Mrs. Sanguines, \$5; J. Fieldhouse, \$10; Sarah McFayden, \$8; Mary McFayden, \$5.—Car'd. The council then adjourned to meet at Cameron on Monday, the 18th inst.

School Board Proceedings.

Fenelon Falls, June 6th, 1894.

Board met, members all present except Dr. Graham: the chairman in the chair. Minutes of last meeting read and approved.

Moved by Mr. McDougall, seconded by Mr. Dickson, That the following accounts be paid and the chairman give his orders for the same: E. D. Hand, printing auditors' report, \$10; Robert Rutherford, repairing fences, \$9 50.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Sandford, seconded by Mr. Nevison, That Miss Bessie Nie's application be accepted for the south division school at a salary of \$215 per annum.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. McDougall, seconded by Mr. Sandford, That the following teachers be engaged for the ensuing year: Mr. Maybee, at former salary of \$550; Miss Sullivan, do. do., \$300; Miss Cullon, do. do., \$300; Miss Macniven, do. do., \$275; and that Miss Cameron be engaged for six months, on account of her certificate expiring in December, 1894 at a salary of one hundred and fifteen dollars for the half year.—Carried.

The board then adjourned.
