

Fog Purifies The Air-

A fog has beneficial effect in partially purifying the atmosphere. This is borne out by the fact that when a fog subsides the deposit contains the carbon, sulphur, organic gases, and other injurious and irritating particles which formerly existed in a state of suspension in the atmosphere. The "Lancet" says: "Just as water is freed from objectionable suspended matter by the addition of an impalpable powder, or a mixture which gives rise to a fine precipitate, so probably is the air deprived of suspended impurities by the subsidence of the moisture particles in which the impurities become entangled. It is a matter of common observation that the air is remarkably clear after the subsidence of fog or mist."

A German statistician finds that the most "unlucky" day of the week so far as accidents to human beings are concerned, is not Friday, but Monday; 16.74 per cent. of all accidents occur on Mondays, 15.51 per cent on Tuesdays. 16.31 per cent. on Wednesday, 15.47 per cent. on Thursdays, 16.38 per cent. on Fridays, the same per cent on Saturdays and 2.69 per cent. on Sundays. From these figures it not only appears that Friday is not the unluckiest day in this regard, but that one day is pretty much as another. The "lucky" character of Sunday is explained by the fact of little or no work being done that day.




