Twenty burglaries were reported in Brooklyn on Friday night. Seven inches of snow fell at Saranac Lake, N. Y., on Saturday.

The great Krupp gun has reached the World's Fair grounds.

A special from Thibodieux, La., says 15 persons were killed and more than 14 injured by the cyclone which swept over that region on Friday.

The new Cunard steamer Campania had a trial trip on Saturday. She ran at a maximum speed of 27 miles an hour, the greatest speed ever attained by any steamship.

John Johnston, the "blue nigger," a convict in Auburn prison, ran amuck in the prison on Monday morning. He killed one fellow-convict and wounded two others with a sharp knife, when a keeper shot him, rendering him powerless.

A decision has been rendered by Collector J. J. Low at Suspension Bridge that a contract made in the United States, although made by a foreigner, is not prohibited by any existing law. Under this interpretation Canadians may live in Canada and work in the States.

At a "church hugging bee" in Alabama the other evening a man, while blind-folded, hugged his own wife for several minutes, and when he learned the fact he got mad and demanded his money back. This made his wife mad and she demanded double rates for her part in the transaction.

A London newspaper relates that a few days ago Queen Victoria was greatly charmed by a piece of music performed by the band playing in public at Osborne, and sent one of her attendants to learn the name of the piece. The attendant came back and reported, with some embarrassment, that it was entitled "Come Where the Booze is Cheaper."

The Woodstock board of trade has passed a resolution in favor of the exclusion of American silver from the Dominion. Coined silver is the only useful product of the United States which might be profitably excluded by Canadians. Not that its inpouring would deprive Canadians of work, but rather that it would induce them to pay for it with more work than in was actually worth. In taking American silver Canadians deal in a product which is rapidly decreasing in value; a transaction inevitably resulting in loss.

Henry Ashland, a young man 18 years of age, who resided with his mother one and a half miles west of Huntingdon, met with a terrible death. He had been employed cutting wood at George Badore's, and having broken his axe-helve started, after having taken supper at his employer's, to return home. Near the house he slipped on some ice and fell heavily upon the blade of the axe, which he had slipped into his coat pocket. The result was a terrible gash in his side which extended through the ribs to the lungs, entering the diaphragm. The unfortunate young man died within a few hours after the accident.

The bones of the whales that the German kaiser slaughtered in the North sea last summer are to be turned into furniture for the Norwegian boathouse at Potsdam.

Western United States railways have agreed to raise the price of meals on their dining cars from seventy-five cents to a dollar. Their excuse is that the meals actually cost \$1.25 to provide.

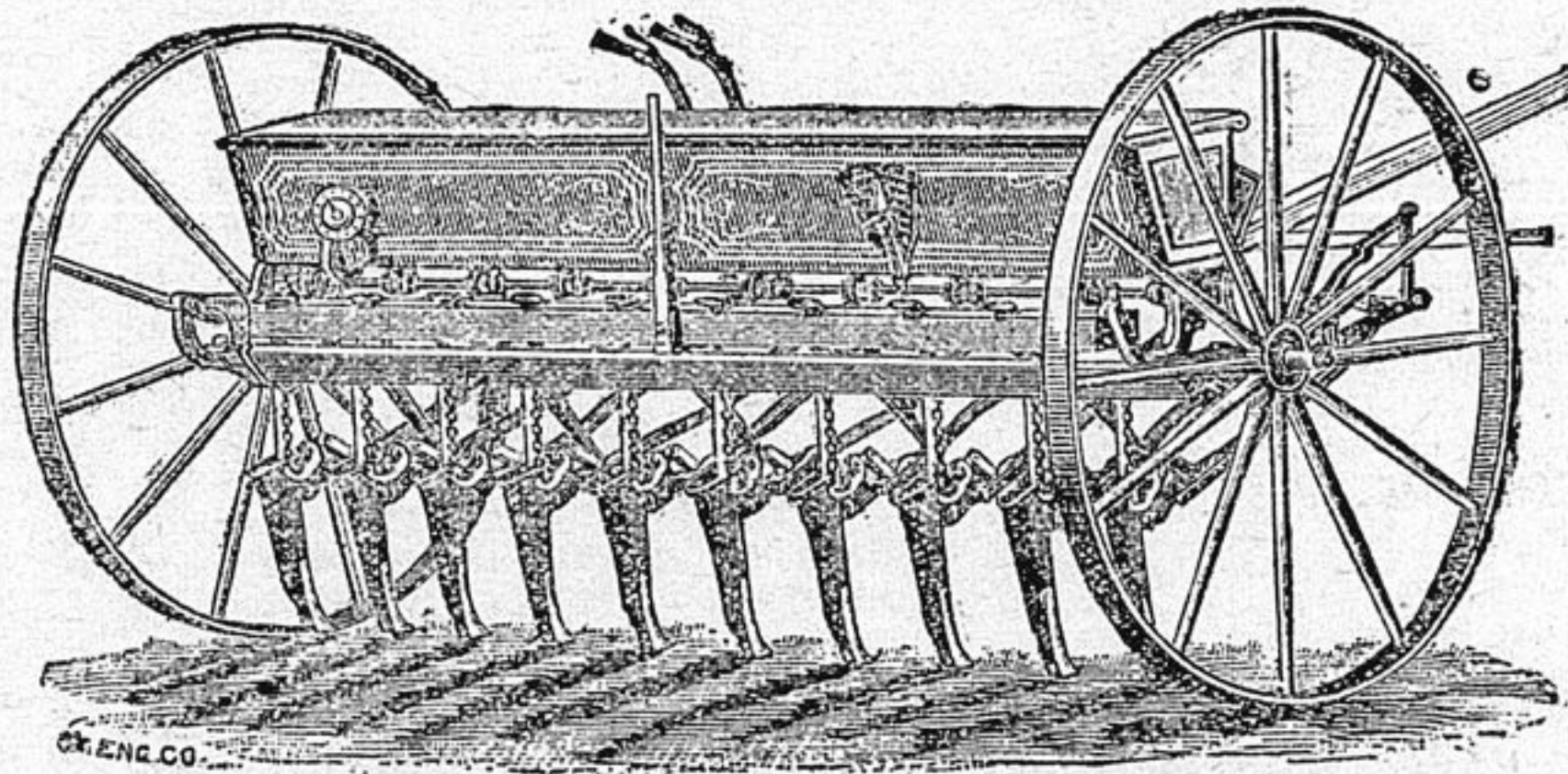
