Ulster and Home Rule.

LONDON, April 29.—A large number of residents of Ulster belonging to the Presbyterian and Unitarian denominations repudiate the resolution in opposition to Irish home rule which was sent to Lord Salisbury in the name of, and representing the opinions of, the Protestants of Ulster. These home rule protestants have therefore caused a communication to be sent to Prime Minister Gladstone, expressing confidence in Mr. Gladstone and his policy in regard to Ireland. Mr. Gladstone has sent a reply to the communication, in which he states that he is pleased to observe the existence of such an enlightened opinion as that held by his correspondents amid the sea of violence and intolerance at Belfast.

At Ishpeming, Michigan, May day was ushered in by six inches of snow. Nearly \$2,000,000 worth of new buildings are under way and projected in Winnipeg.

One of the largest islands on the Australian coasts disappeared recently.

Canada's 11-ton cheese broke the floor of the building in which it was placed at Chicago, and sank twelve feet to the solid ground.

The Marquis of Londonderry has the smallest pony in the world. It weighs only 16 lbs., and at its birth was but 1 1/2 inches high.

The wettest spot in England is Snathwaite, a little place in Cumberland, some eight miles from Keswick. It has an annual rainfall of 173 inches—it was 224 in 1866—which is the highest in Great Britain.

At a recent session of the Division Court at Dundas the case of Hunter vs. Freelon Fair Directors was tried. It was an action brought by Samuel Hunter, a dairyman, against the directors of the fair for \$20, the amount of a prize awarded to him for butter at the Freelon show and subsequently disallowed on a protest by the directors; the contention being that Hunter was a professional butter maker. At the trial Judge Muir dismissed the case, holding that the judgment of the directors on the protest was final.

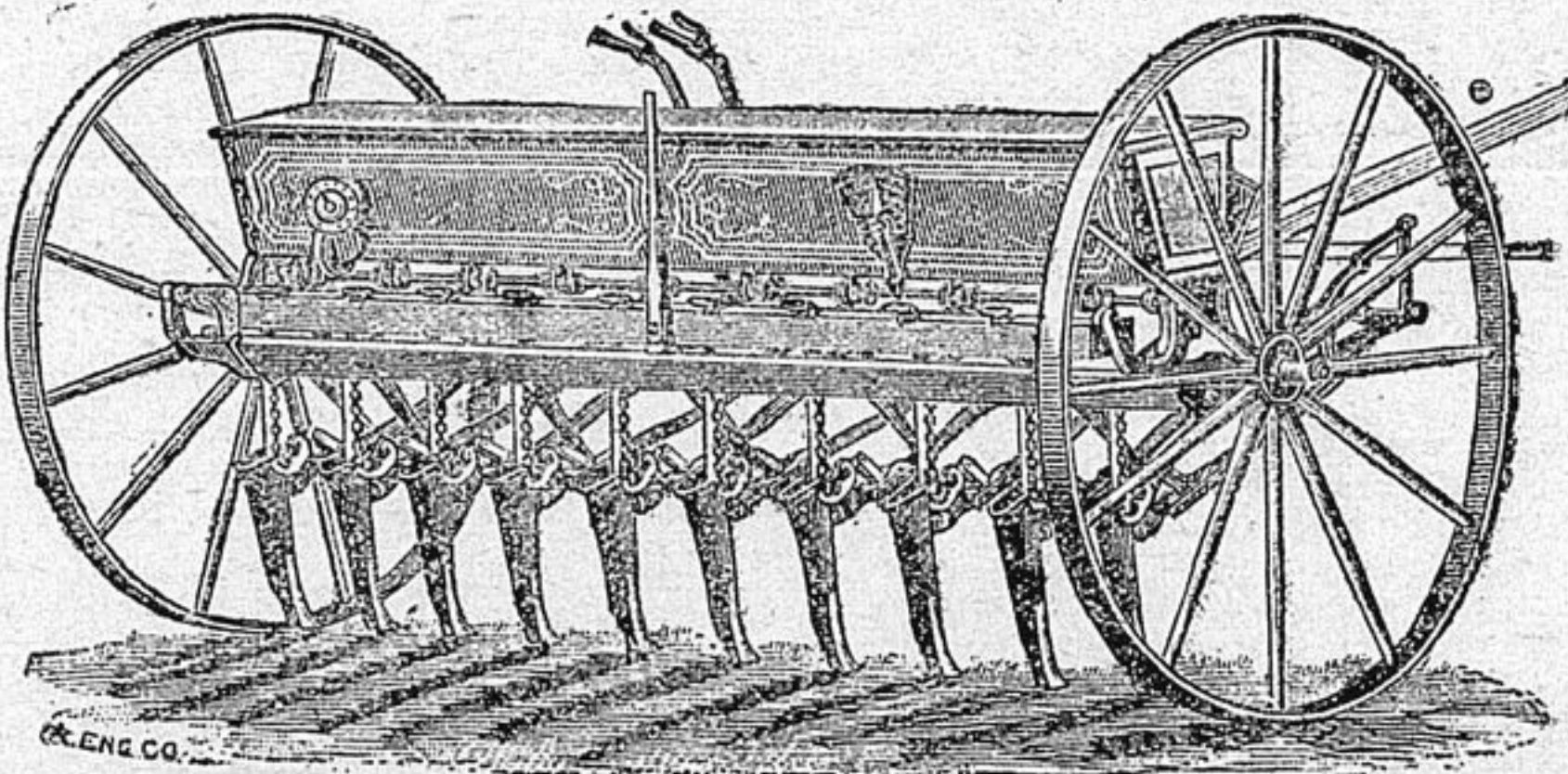
