**A SERIOUS OFFENCE.**—A subscriber who lives south of the river tells us that on Sunday morning last, during church time, a number of soft maple trees inside his and a neighbor's fences, as well as some at the road side, were wilfully mutilated by boys, who were old enough to know better, and whose names are known. They jabbed and cut the trees with their knives to such an extent that the sap flowed freely, apparently out of "pure cussedness," and our informant says that the same thing was done two years ago. It is a serious offence to destroy or damage shade trees—which, under the most favorable circumstances, take a long time to grow—and the penalty for so doing is a heavy one.
