GERMAN RAILROAD SPEED.

Mails and Ties Damaged by Speed in Electric Trials.

Several months have elapsed since the close of the experiments in highspeed electrical traction over the specially prepared railroad line between Berlin and Zossen. No official report of the results obtained has yet been printed. But from authentic sources some highly interesting information has been obtained.

It will be remembered that the purpose of the trials was to ascertain how high a rate of speed, by the use of electric power, might be practically and safely attained with the track and cars provided. The trials HOW began at forty miles an hour, the speed being gradually increased until about eighteen or twenty days after the first trial was made a speed of 93.2 miles an hour was obtained.
