CATTLE FOR ALGOMA.—On Thursday of last week Mr. Davis, of Campbellford, left the Falls with thirteen carloads of cattle, some of which came from Kinmount, and the next day he left North Bay with a grand total of 1,300 head. They were going to three ranches in Algoma, and all of them were steers, from one to three years old. On the afternoon of Wednesday a single drove of 156 went through the Falls to the railway station. How is there to be the predicted fall in the price of beef if cattle are driven away at that rate?

THE NEW CHURCH.—Work on the site of the new English church was commenced on Monday, and men and horses employed by the corporation are deepening the drain in front of it. A NARROW ESCAPE.—The *Post* says that Messrs. Harry Tims and Allan Dougal, of the Lindsay branch of the Bank of Montreal staff, had a narrow escape from drowning, on Sunday morning, while sailing home in a canoe from Sturgeon Point.
