

STRUCK BY LIGHTNING.—During the violent storm on Wednesday afternoon a barn on Mr. Wm. Rutherford's farm in Verulam was struck and had one of its ends shattered by lightning, but was not set on fire. The handle of a fork in the stable part of the building was split all to pieces and the flooring of one of the stalls was splintered; but Mr. David McFarland's team, in the adjoining stall, were unhurt. A span of horses, owned by Mr. John Jankin, which were standing, unhitched from their waggon, under a shed at the end of the barn, were knocked down, but not injured by the shock of the lightning, and were so frightened that they sprang to their feet and ran as far as the road, where somebody caught them.

TALL OATS.—A recent issue of the Lindsay Post contained a notice of some tall oats grown by Mr. A. L. Minthorne of Mariposa, but Mr. Edwin Beacock, of Powles's Corner, can beat them. Mr. Minthorne's oats were sown on the last day of March, and the tallest stalk that could be found was 4 feet 9 inches. Mr. Beacock's were sown on the first of April, and the tallest stalk, now standing up in the corner of the Gazette office, measures five feet, which—now we come to think of it—is nearly as tall as we are. STURGEON-POINT REGATTA.—The regatta held at Sturgeon Point last Saturday afternoon was a decided success. The boats left the starting line at 2 p. m., with a fresh breeze blowing. The *Shamrock*, owned and sailed by Rev. R. MacNamara, of Fenelon Falls, proved to be the fastest boat, coming in a good quarter of a mile ahead of the others; but Dr. Ryerson's dingy was given the prize, on the ground that, if not so fast, she was at least smaller than the foremost boat. The sailing canoe race was won by Mr. Eric Ryerson and two friends; the double paddling ladies' canoe race by Misses Martin and Townsend; the tub race by Mr. Roy Wilson, and the single canoe race by Mr. Victor Gladman.

W. M. S. AUXILIARIES.—The fourth annual convention of the Women's Missionary Auxiliaries of the Lindsay District was held in the Methodist church here on Thursday of last week, and was in progress when the Gazette went to press. There were three sessions—in the morning, afternoon and evening—and all who had been appointed delegates were present. The morning session was presided over by Mrs. Jeffery, the district organizer, and in the evening the chair was occupied by Rev. Mr. Garbutt, pastor of the church. The reports of the delegates showed an increase in both membership and funds, and the organization appears to be in a very flourishing condition. There was good music by the choir, and several excellent papers were read and addresses delivered; but the latter were brief, as each speaker's time was necessarily limited to a few minutes.

POSTPONED EXCURSION.—Owing to an accident to the steamer *Kenosha*, the Epworth League excursion from the Falls to Bobcaygeon, advertised for last Friday night, was unavoidably postponed *sine die*, but will be held as soon as possible. The boat started all right—though an hour and a half behind time—but didn't "git thar," in consequence of the breaking of the main shaft just as the first cottage on Sturgeon Point was reached. There was nothing to do but to cast anchor and wait for help, which didn't arrive until much later than was expected. The signal of distress consists of three long shrieks of the whistle, and then another one kept up until the boiler is almost out of breath. But neither of the Trent Valley Navigation Co's steamers was within hearing, and, after the signal had been several times repeated, at short intervals, without being followed by a response, news of the *Kenosha's* predicament was telegraphed or telephoned to Bobcaygeon and Lindsay, and some time after midnight the *Alexandra* came along and towed the disabled steamer back to the Falls. Before the passengers landed Rev. Mr. Garbutt told them to keep their tickets, as the excursion would be run again at a later date. Unless it be postponed for at least three weeks it will not be by moonlight; but that won't matter, as the *Kenosha* is illuminated by electricity, and, even if that should fail, there will be enough bright eyes on board to at least partially illuminate the steamer from stem to stern. 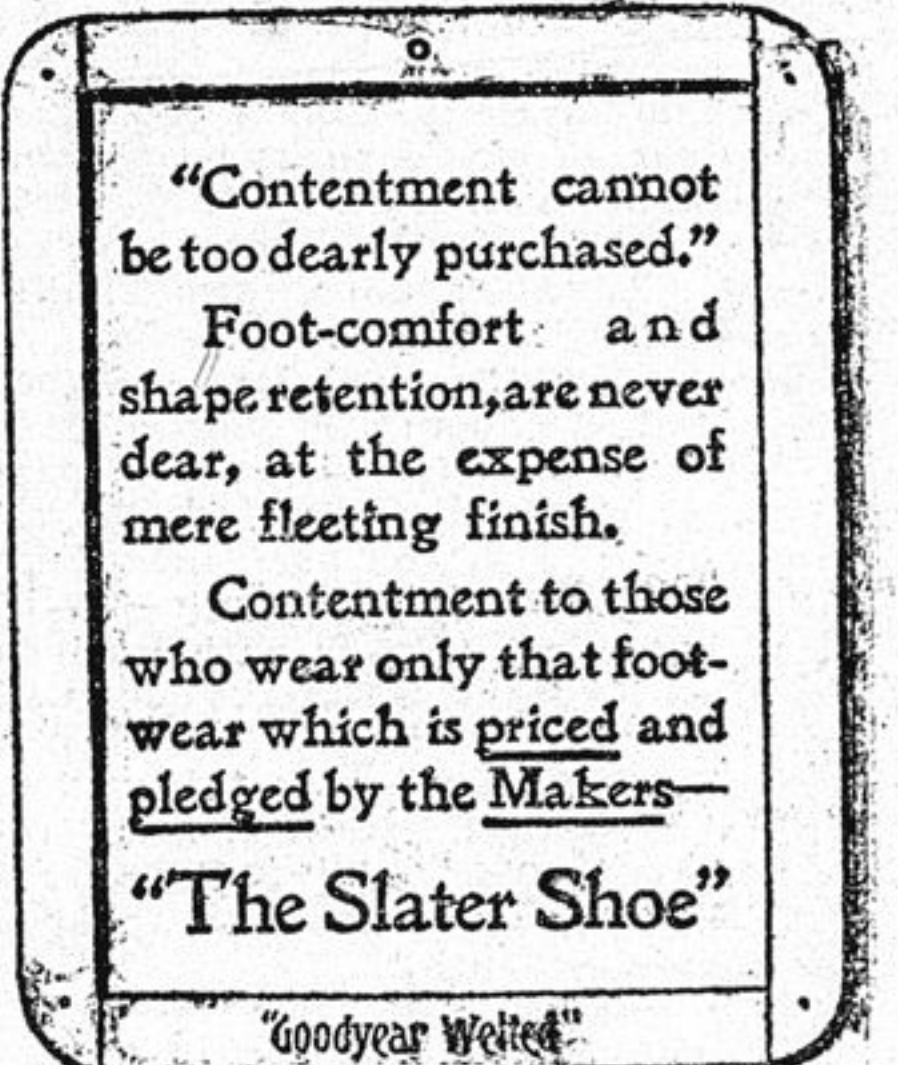
