

THE SIZE OF IT.

Few People Have Any Idea of the Extent of Canada.

The new railway line across the continent to be built by the Grand Trunk will run through a country that is 800 miles north of Toronto. This new line will parallel the C. P. R. across the Western plains, yet it will run 300 miles north of the road it parallels. This means that although, in the public mind and to the eye, as one looks at a map, the roads may seem to compete with each other and give a duplicate service, there stretches between them a range of rich country about as far across as it is from Toronto to Montreal. Through this intervening country, however, the Canadian Northern will run, but even so, all three roads will have a wide range of country to open up and from which to draw business.

It has long been said that the Peace River country, through which the Grand Trunk will carry its line, is destined to be the greatest wheat-growing region in America. To realize the size and possibilities of the Canada of the future one needs but to reflect that these vast wheat fields will lie 800 miles north of Toronto. Time thus gives effective answer to those people in the United States and Europe who have charged that Canada is too far north to ever amount to much.

PERFUMES FOR HEALTH.

Woman With Scented Handkerchief a Benefactor.

To preserve one's beauty and enhance one's attractiveness, perfumes are necessary. They are stimulating and refreshing, especially lavender, lemon, rose and violet. They may prove even more beneficial by destroying disease germs.

The liberal use of scent on the handkerchief is calculated to make it antiseptic and to destroy the germs in it. The use of a perfumed or antiseptic handkerchief is, therefore, consistent with the dictates of bacteriology. So that, instead of practising a luxurious habit, a woman who puts scent on her handkerchiefs may actually be doing good to her neighbors by checking the distribution of infectious materials.

The basis of all perfumes is an essential oil of some kind, derived either naturally from flowers or leaves, or artificially by a synthetic process. In either case, the essential oil is a powerful antiseptic and possesses disinfecting properties, not less in degree than those of carbolic acid.

The love of perfumes has never been the monopoly of the sybarite. Nero, the tyrant, had not only his garments, but also his body, daily sprayed with water distilled from the choicest roses of his empire.

Louis XIV. was inseparable from the heavy scent of orange blossoms. The great Richelieu lived in rooms so filled with flower odors that his courtiers nearly swooned upon entering them.

Queen Elizabeth of England perfumed her wigs with Spanish leather steeped in musk. In the boudoirs of fashionable ladies perfumed candles were burned, and perfumed blocks or cakes were thrown into the fire in order to fill the air with fragrance, and coffers containing expensive scents were kept.

HANGING IN THE ROOM. A kind of scented lozenge was used to perfume the breath, and wigs or one's own locks were scented.

The old process of perfuming the hair was first to wash it thoroughly, drying it carefully, and then heavily impregnate it with the odor from a burning pastille. The head was loosely covered with a cloth, the

Don't let the scent go beyond a suggestion; never strong enough to be very noticeable to others.

If perfumes, as some will tell you, exercise a very marked effect on certain temperaments, they should be chosen with deliberation and discretion, if you want to be lovable and amiable.

A violet scented atmosphere, for example, makes those who are surrounded by its influence affectionate and peace-loving. Women of lovable natures are always fond of violets.

Heliotrope usually finds devotees among the dainty, neat and rather unassuming dispositions, who dislike fuss and notoriety.

Rose perfume is most frequently used by those of warm-hearted, unimaginative temperaments who are inclined to extravagance and have a disregard of the more serious issues of life.
