The new railway line across the continent to be built by the Grand Frunk will run through a country that is 800 miles north of Toronto. This new line will parallel the C. P. R. across the Western plains, yet it will run 300 miles north of the road it parallels. This means that although, in the public mind and to the eye, as one looks at a map, the roads may seem to compete with each other and give a duplicate service, there stretches between them a range of rich country about as far across as it is from Toronto to Mont-Through this intervening country, however, the Canadian Northern will run, but even so, all three roads will have a wide range of country to open up and from

It has long been said that the Feace River country, through which the grand Trunk will carry its line, is destined to be the greatest wheat-growing region in America. To realize the size and possibilities of the Canada of the future one needs but to reflect that these vast wheat fields will lie 800 miles north of Toronto. Time thus gives effective answer to those people in the United States and Europe who have charged that Canada is too far north to ever amount to much.
