## Village Council Proceedings.

Council met pursuant to adjournment. Present, Jas. Dickson, reeve, and councillors Fitzgerald and Slater. Minutes read and approved. Mr. Sandford entered and took his seat.

Moved by Mr. Fitzgerald, seconded by Mr. Slater, That By-law No. 311, entitled a by-law to prevent public nuisances, be now introduced and read a first time.—Carried.

Councillor Martin entered and took his seat. By-law read and passed in the usual manner.

On motion of Messrs. Fitzgerald and Slater, a by-law for enacting general rules and regulations of the village of Fenelon Falls, and for enforcing the same, was introduced, read and passed.

The clerk was instructed to get 100 copies of each of above by-laws printed and posted up.

Mr. McNally, representing Mr. Pugsley, waited on the council re the market square lease.

Moved by Mr. Sandford, seconded by Mr. Fitzgerald, That this council complete the lease to Mr. Pugsley of that part of the market square described in the lease, and that the reeve and clerk be authorized to sign said lease.—C'd.

Mr. S. Brokenshire waited on the council re survey of cemetery, and Mr. A. McLeod was heard respecting purchase of old Presbyterian church.

Moved by Mr. Sandford, seconded by Mr. Fitzgerald, That the council ask for tenders to supply gravel by the yard for streets. Tenders to be handed to Geo. Martin by May 20th, and the words "tenders for gravel" to be written on envelopes.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Fitzgerald, seconded by Mr. Slater, That the auditors' report be returned for correction.—Car'd.

Moved by Mr. Martin, seconded by Mr. Slater, That the following accounts be paid:—E. Lausfield \$2.56, J. Quibell \$2.50, R. O. Young \$7, John T. Thompson \$11.25, S. Brokenshire \$5.15, E. D. Hand \$1, H. York 50c., N. Valier \$2, W. Golden \$9.05, S. Nevison \$109.16.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Fitzgerald, seconded by Mr. Sandford, That S. Nevison's application for position of constable be considered, although handed in two days too late. Yeas, Fitzgerald, Sandford and Martin. Nay, Slater.

Moved by Mr. Sandford, seconded by Mr. Martin, That S. Nevison be appointed chief constable for the corporation, to be on duty from 10 a. m. to 11 p. m., at a salary of \$1 per day and all fees. Yeas, Fitzgerald, Sandford and Martin. Nay, Slater.

A by-law ratifying appointment was read and passed in the usual manner.

Moved by Mr. Fitzgerald, seconded by Mr. Martin, That the following abatements be made the collector:—Green & Ellis \$9.62, Miss Dexter \$2.50, Mechanics' Institute \$17.50, Mrs. Warren \$5.63, John Thomson \$107.25; John McKinnon \$3, and that taxes against south half west half lot 2 and south half lot 1, south of Bond and east of Colborne streets, \$16, be returned to the county treasurer.—Carried.

Moved by Mr. Fitzgerald, seconded by Mr. Sandford, That the collector's roll be received and bondsmen be released.—Carried.

## Mechanics' Institute Meeting.

The general annual meeting of the members of the Fenelon Falls Mechanics' Institute was held on the 9th inst. The treasurer's and librarian's reports were adopted, and the following officers appointed for the ensuing year: Thos. Robson, president; Jas. Dickson, vice-president; W. L. Robson, treasurer; M. Kelly, secretary; and Rev. W. Farncomb, Rev. J. Fraser, F. Magee, H. Pearce, Geo. Nie, W. T. Junkin, L. Deyman, A. Clark Jr. and J. Arnold, directors.

The library at the present time contains 2,773 volumes. The number of books issued during the past year was 3,451 volumes. There were added last year about 250 volumes, at a cost of \$180, and the reading room is supplied with 35 newspapers and magazines. The membership is 113. Subscription is only \$1 per year. The library is open twice each week for the exchange of books, on Tuesdays and Saturdays.
