THE WORLD'S EIGGEST WATCH.

It Is Four Inches Wide, Gold and Weigh Two Pounds.

The largest watch in the world was made in London for William Wilkens, founder of the firm of William Wilkens & Co., dealers in curled hair and bristles, of Baltimore. It is kept by his sons as an heirloom.

Mr. Wilkens was an odd man in many ways. One of his peculiar desires was to possess things that were entirely different from other things in the world. His big watch was a manifestation of this trait. It cost him \$2,500. He ordered it in 1866, but it was not finished until 1869. The massive gold chain, to which it was attached, weighs four pounds and cost \$800.

The white enamel dial is four inches in diameter. The case is elaborately engraved inside and outside, the design on the front representing Mr. Wilkens's Baltimore factory and residence. 




