#### THE FACE IN ILLNESS.

The face is a good index to the state of one's physical being, and from it symptoms of disease can be detected almost before the patient is aware that anything serious is the matter with him. To make a general rule, it may be stated that the up-per third of the face is altered in expression in affections of the brain, the middle third, in the diseases of the organs contained in the abdominal cavity.


