CARE OF CREAM.

After the milk has been carefully skimmed, the cream should be kept in a covered can with the temperature somewhat below fifty degrees, and stirred well each time fresh cream is added.

Cream should never be set in open crocks or pails in cellars, pantries, or any other place where the air is not pure, nor where the temperature is above sixty degrees, as it is sure to liable to result in loss of hearing or sour and will often be in churning smell, or develop into consumption. condition before it is wanted. 


