The arms represent the oars, and they may easily be "feathered" by placing them near the surface with the fingers slighty outstretched; As the feet advances first, this figure presents a curious sight. A clever girl could do this trick easily as well as the one in which the bathing costume is changed under water. The swimmer puts on, over her ordinary bathing dress, another one that is at least a size too large, without fastening it at the neck; standing on the diving platform, she must jump or dive to the bottom of the water, and, hastily divesting herself of the second dress, swim to the top, carrying it in her hands. Deep water, in preference to shallow, should be chosen for this feat which perhaps sounds a trifle difficult, although in reality it is not. A good way to practice remaining under water is to sink to the bottom on the knees and remain there as long as possible; raising the hands above the head will keep you there some time, but if ever you are in danger of drowning do not throw up your arms.




