

UMBRELLAS AND BOOTS FOR DOGS.

How the Pet Dog is Treated by Some London Ladies.

Blankets for dogs are common enough, but a new luxury has been introduced in London, where most foolish practices in the services of animals originate.

In that city the weather is often almost incessantly rainy, and dogs who spend much of their time indoors are said to suffer much from rheumatism contracted from wet feet when they go out. 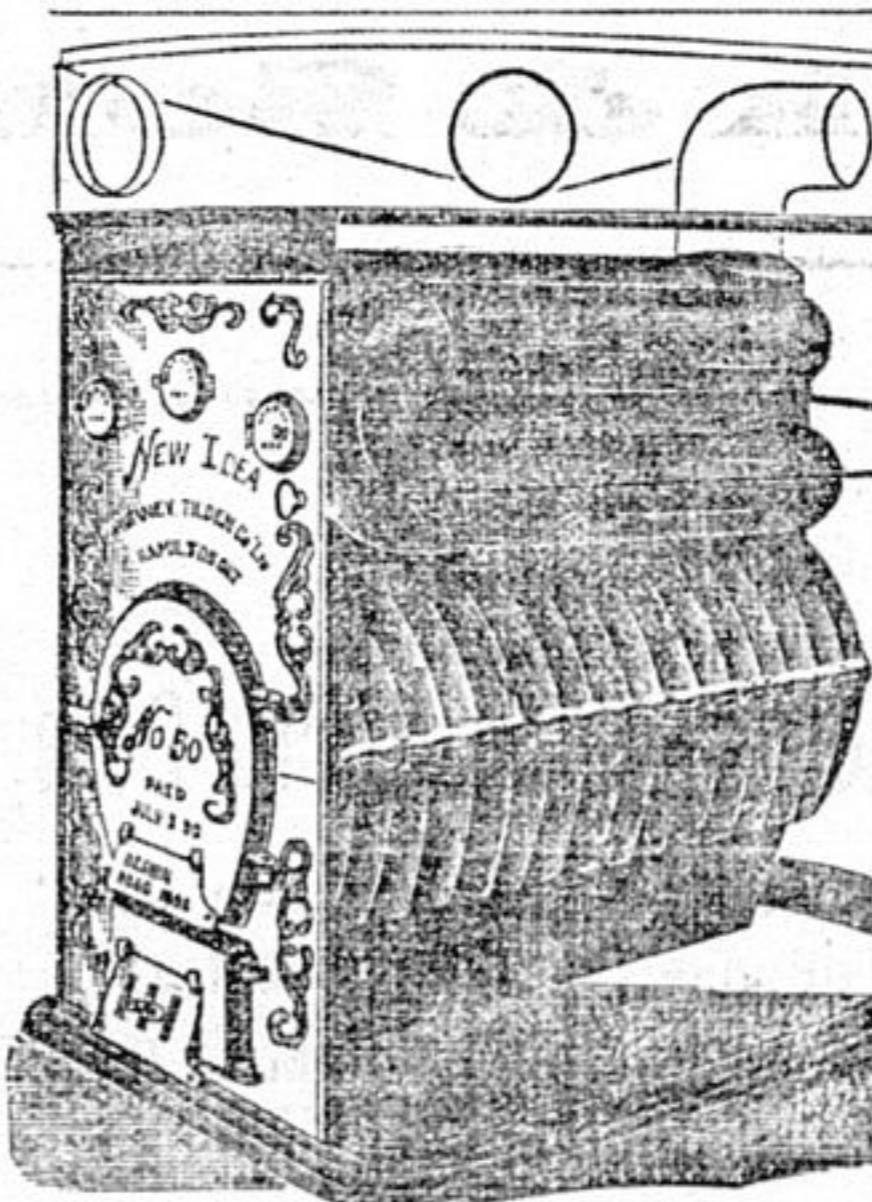
