

CHILDREN'S HAIR.

A child's head, like its skin, body and limbs, is very tender, and susceptible to injury from a coarse brush or comb in the hands of an attendant not always gentle. The oil or grease put upon the head to produce the idea of smoothness acts only as a means to imprison dirt and other secretions that should be cleaned away, in order to induce a healthy growth of hair, and preserve the vigor of the scalp itself.

From infancy the child's head should be washed. Pure boiled rain water is best for stimulating the tender scalp. Dry with a soft cloth thoroughly, and protect the head from cold while damp. When dry, brush the hair gently the way it grows upon the baby's head. Don't use a brush intended for the head of a grown person, but have in the baby basket a little soft bristle one.

Sometimes, from delicate health or feeble circulation, the child's hair is very light and thin, resembling an artificial wool. It is lifeless and dry, separating into little locks. The scalp needs a gentle stimulant which will be found in the following:

Glycerine, one ounce; good cologne, four ounces; ammonia water, one-eighth of an ounce; oil of origanum, thirty drops.

Rub into the little scalp, while still moist from washing, with gentle friction of the finger tips. It will render the hair soft, glossy and flexible. It is volatile and contains no gum or grease that obstructs the pores. The ends of the hair should be clipped every few weeks. It induces a flow of the natural oils contained in each strand of hair.

Neglect of this duty is one of the prime causes of harsh, dry and brittle hair in young and old. If intelligent treatment is given the scalp in childhood fewer bald heads would be seen, and none of the stunted and scrubby growths in after years.

JEWELLED PINS.

Real jeweled pins will be worn this season and during the winter, not only in the hair arranged a la Japonaise, but they will appear upon dress hats and elegant evening bonnets. Jewel cases and caskets are being searched for odd pins, slides, brooches and other ornaments which have been put away as obsolete to now furnish decoration for various sports of the toilet. The fashion of wearing real gems in the coiffure arose from an example set by the Princess of Wales, who began the society to now furnish decoration for at a very fashionable church wedding at the Brompton Oratory in a violet velvet bonnet, the soft plumes run through with a superb diamond-hilted sabre and the brim dotted with small real gems. This fashion, though really appropriate only to royalty, has been adopted by wealthy cosmopolitan women, but the display of diamonds worn in such form seems not quite in good taste, and the risks attending it are obvious.
